WASHINGTON, DC- The 24th Annual Arabian Sights Film Festival kicks off Friday, October 18 to present 11 new and exciting films plus a shorts program and a virtual reality experience from the Arab world. Running through Sunday, October 27th, the Festival features captivating films from numerous Arab countries including Egypt, Lebanon, Morocco, Palestine, Tunisia, and the UAE, plus other European and Arab co-productions.

The Arabian Sights Film Festival showcases films that demonstrate the range and commitment of directors who invariably manage to tell moving stories while exploring issues facing their region.
